## ✕ Reduce

Most dining locations on campus will give you a discount if you use a mug to purchase a beverage of comparable size; at the very least you can feel good about not throwing away a cup after you're done. SAVE occasionally sells these handy reusable mugs or you might pick one up at a career fair, clip it to your bag with that carabiner you also got from Microsoft.

There are several means of reducing the amount of paper you consume when printing on Athena. Firstly, print double sided when possible such as drafts of papers or emails (do you really need a hard-copy of that offer for C1a11s?) by appending 2 to the printer name e.g.; python2 instead of python. Secondly consider disabling header pages, this can be easily done if you run setup save at the athena% prompt. As a bonus you'll also gain easy access to double-sided printing with the dup2 utility and two pages-per-side printing with dup4. Finally learn to use lprq and lprmq to handle unwanted and errant printouts.

The epitome of reuse resources is of course the reuse email list for the exchange of free stuff amongst members of the MIT community see [web.mit.edu/reuse/](http://web.mit.edu/reuse/). Many community service student groups on campus such as the APO will accept a variety of books and the MIT Libraries will also accept donations for the stacks. The Used Computer Factory works with the Public Service Center's CommuniTech program to refurbish used computers for donation to local families. UCF accepts wroking components for use in their efforts.

During finals week of the spring semester SAVE, in coordination with Facilities and student volunteers, runs Stuff-Fest in the dorms on campus. A sort of free for all where you can take, or leave whatever suits your fancy. The leftovers are sorted for recycling or donation to various charities where possible.

## Recycle

Most Institute buildings including dormitories participate in a campus-wide recycling program for the usual suspects including paper and comingles; the term comingles simply means plastic, glass and metal (steel and aluminum). However, be sure to place your *clean* recyclables in the correct bin!

What's considered recyclable paper at MIT can be thought of as "anything that tears". This includes colored, glossy, and office paper; envelopes; as well as paperboard and carboard. You should not try to recycle carbon paper, wax or plastic coated papers such as milk cartons, or pizza boxes.

Paper bins are generally blue and comingle bins green, if a recycling bin says its for "Newspaper only" it's lying; actually its just old; and will accept all normally recyclable paper.

Rechargeable batteries such as NiCad, NiMH and lead-acid can be recycled at E19-111. If you live off campus or E19 is inconvenient most Staples and Radio Shack locations as well as the Cambridge DPW, see Central Square map; will accept these as well. Any cordless device, motherboard, or UPS will have such a battery please remove and recycle it. It is illegal to dispose of lead-acid batteries in household waste.

Massachusetts recently enacted a law making it illegal to dispose of CRTs (computer monitors and conventional televisions) as household waste due to their lead content. If you have CRTs or other electronics you were unable to pass-off on reuse, you'll have to bite the bullet and pay to dispose of these unless you're lucky and facilities is a having a grace period (such as the end of the year drop-off associated with Stuff-Fest). Facilities can dispose of electronic waste for a nominal pick-up fee of \$15 (per trip). Cambridge DPW will do curbside pickup of CRTs for \$15 each, and it is also possible to recycle computers at Microcenter.

Rubber-soled shoes can be brought to the Z center or Nike on Newbury Street for recycling and a second life as a high-performance running surface.


